# From the Desk of Fr. Leo

We use many adjectives in referring to God. We say that God is wise, powerful, merciful, and loving. Before each adjective we may place the word "most". An impressive list can be drawn up to indicate the attributes of God, all of them in the superlative, but a question remains. Is God happy?

One would think so, God does not have to drive the freeways, he never has to stand in line for anything, and he is not required to pay taxes. With all that, something seems to be missing, even in the revelation of God to his Chosen People. The People of God were surrounded by tribes and nations which believed in many gods. They worshiped the god of agriculture and the god of fertility, the god of peace and the god of war. Some tribes worshiped the sun, the moon and the stars. Each group also had its own national god.

Not so the Israelites. To them God revealed himself as the one, true Lord, the God of all creation. No people were more blessed than they, and yet God still seemed distant and perhaps even lonely in all his majesty. Jesus revealed a fuller picture of God. Through the sacrament of baptism, God has made us his beloved sons and daughters, and through our communion in the body and blood of his Son, he nourishes his gift of life.

This weekend we celebrate the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. It is the reality of a happy God whose life and love we share.


#### Thank you again to all who support our Parish! We know how generous you have been in the changing times!
