

#### From the Desk of Fr. Leo

In a country predominantly Muslim, a nun destroyed the homework of a Muslim child because it was untidy and unfit to be handed in. She was not aware that the homework contained some verse of the Koran. When the child reported this presumed insult against the Koran, reprisal was swift. Barely, did the nun escape with her life by being whisked out of the town and flown elsewhere. Her convent and school were burn to the ground.

Humankind is prone to take reprisal for injury done or supposed harm inflicted on one. He or she even resorts to petty vengeance. If, he or she has been passed over or snubbed, he or she takes it out on his or her offender in some disagreeable way. If he or she has been harmed by word or deed, he or she will try to get even. In some pagan tribes, if one is killed, the brother or close relative takes upon himself the obligation to kill the murderer in turn. In many ways, small and great, humankind retaliates when offended, but Jesus taught just the opposite. His ideal, which He gives us in this weekend's Gospel, is to relinquish all retaliation. He tells us not to repay evil with evil but be willing to suffer injuries and offenses as He did all during His public life and still more during His passion. He does not forbid us to resist unjust attacks on our person, for He also demanded an explanation when struck on the cheek before Annas, the High Priest, but He bids us not to resort to retaliation in return for evil done on one. We are to forego the pleasure of bringing the offender to his or her knees, and a feeling of personal vindictiveness.

How long-suffering and patient is God! When cursed or blasphemed by people, He does not retaliate. When His holy name is ignored or dishonored, He is not out to revenge the offense. This is the spirit Jesus inculcates when He tells St. Peter he must forgive his brother seventy times seven times. For Jesus is the perfect image of the Father. That image He put into the parable of the prodigal son whose father forgave totally all the gross offenses his son had shown him and took him back with the greatest tenderness and love; noting the least, submitting him to punishment. And this same Good Shepherd, how often He has forgiven the many offenses of His brothers and sisters from the many offenses of his brothers from that day until now, and cleansed them in His precious Blood, without exacting any retribution for evil deeds, even though they were

many! By His own example he taught us how to be long-suffering.

The first Christian martyr, St. Stephen, gave us an admirable example of love of enemies, praying for the very persons who stoned him to death. This is the kind of pin-up which ought to adorn our rooms, so that the Christian ideal be always before our eyes. It is bound to have a silent influence on our attitudes, when we find it difficult to forgive an injury received.






